### **Descriptive Report**

The session was attended by 419 students of undergraduate and post graduate students from both aided and self-financed courses and by several faculties degree college.

The event commenced with the prayer of Khalsa College. A formal introduction was given to the officers from Matunga Police Station by Attribute 6, Co-Ordinator Dr. Deepa Parab. Our Honorable Principal, Prof. Dr. Ratna Sharma Ma'am, addressed the gathering.

**PSI Pravin Patil, Cyber Cell Officer Matunga Police station** delivered an informative session covering:

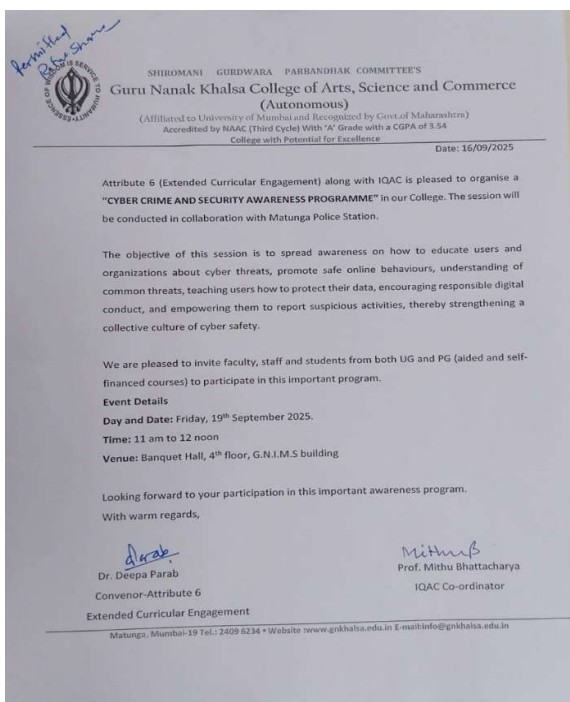
- How WhatsApp accounts are hacked through OTP and fraud links.
- Bank-related frauds and phishing activities.
- Morphing of photos and sextortion cases.
- Fake calls pretending to be from police or packaging agencies.
- Digital arrest scams where fraudsters extort money.
- Deepfake videos and AI-based fraud calls using voices of relatives or friends.
- Remedies such as filing complaints on [cybercrime.gov.in](https://cybercrime.gov.in) or calling the toll-free number 1930.

### **Outcomes / Benefits:**

The Cyber Crime Awareness Programme was extremely beneficial for students. They learned, on how fraudsters operate through calls, links and social media, simple preventive measures to protect themselves from such crimes, official ways to report incidents through government portals and helplines. This programme helped students understand the importance of cyber safety and prepared them to deal with real-life cyber threats more responsibly.

The session was followed by an interactive Q&A session, where several questions were posed by the students, indicative of successful session in achieving its objective of spreading awareness about cybercrime and security. It strengthened students' knowledge about safe digital practices and provided them with the tools to safeguard themselves from fraudsters. The event concluded with a formal vote of thanks by committee member Ms. Bhumika Desai.

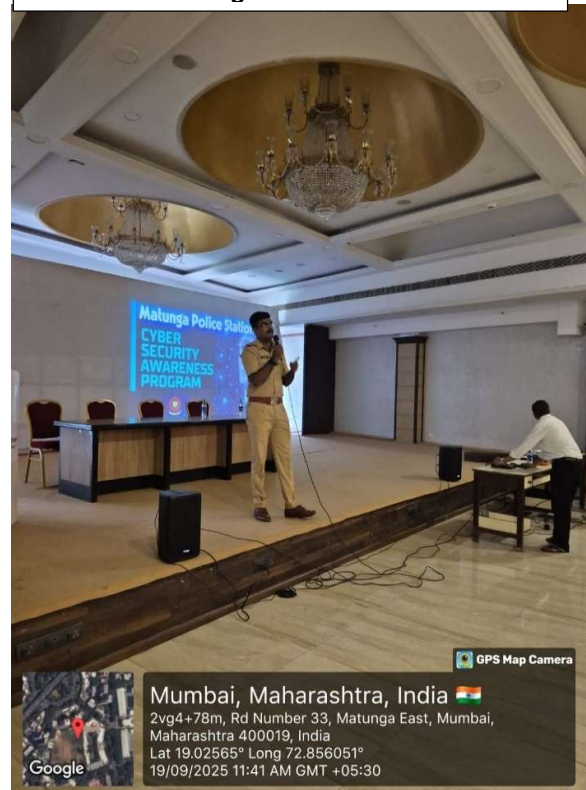

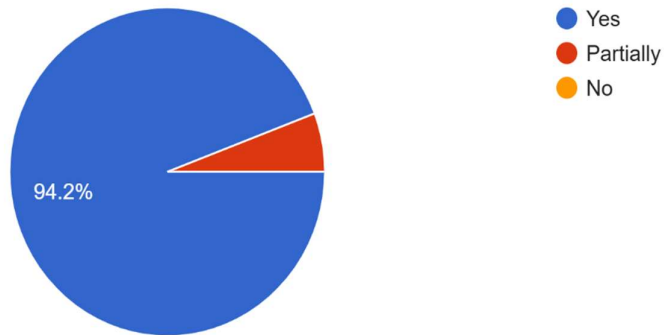

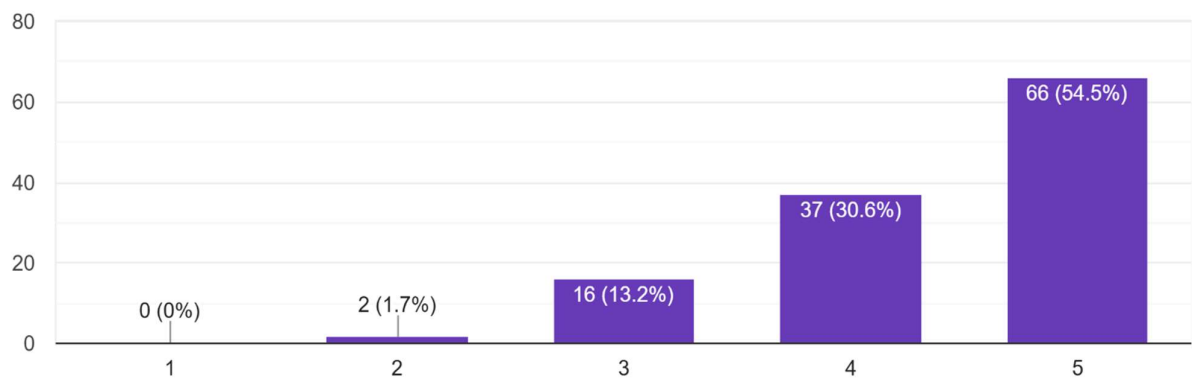
Were the objectives of the programme clearly addressed?

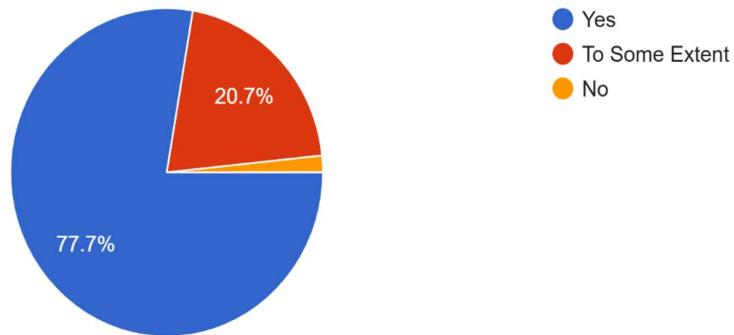
How would you rate the resource person's presentation and communication?

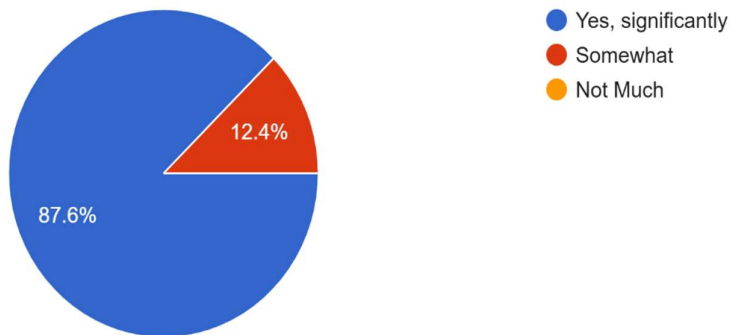

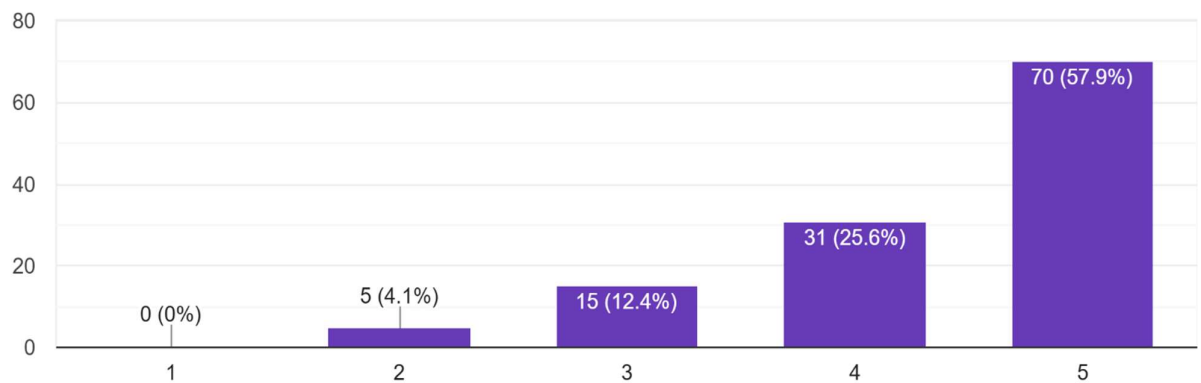
